ANNUAL MEETING

The Annual Business Meeting of the Rutland Historical Society was held on Thursday 29 October at the Nickwackett Firehouse at 96 Center Street, Rutland at 7:00 PM. The business reports were submitted and approved. Board Chairperson Lloyd Davis commented on the outstanding and cooperative work of the Board of Directors, Officers, and Committee Chairpersons as well as the many volunteers during the past year. The Nominations Committee's proposed slate of officers and directors was approved.

A three-part program celebrating the 40th Anniversary of the Society was presented upon adjournment. As President Chuck Piotrowski was unable to attend, Vice-President Jim Davidson chaired the meeting.

Jim, a member of the Society since its inception in 1969, presented the first part of the anniversary program that covered the lack of a historical society for nearly 100 years since the town's first 100-year celebration in 1870, the founding of the Society in 1969, its growth, and some of its activities in the last 40 years.

Part two of the program consisted of brief reports by committee chairpersons on important accomplishments in their areas of responsibility during the current year. The reports of the activities of the many volunteers were impressive as committee after committee reported on their accomplishments. It was obviously a very good year and highly appropriate for the 40th Anniversary.

President Chuck Piotrowski was unable to attend the meeting in person

as his professional employment took him to Florida to receive both a corporate and a personal award from an international organization. The Society is especially proud of Chuck's performance outside the Society as well as inside. With his usual resourcefulness, Chuck recorded an eight-minute videotaped vision of the Society's future. He noted that scanning materials into a digital format will allow the Society to both preserve materials and at the same time save storage space. Although this is a massive undertaking for the Society, the past year's exploration with the technology on some individual projects gives evidence that the Society volunteers can do this. Chuck reminded all that this is not to replace the valuable human interaction of the members of the Society with each other and with the public. Books, papers, and photos will not disappear in the wake of technological advancement.

Attendees shared a 40th Anniversary cake with a tasty punch. There was a great deal of conversation as folks enjoyed both the refreshments and a refreshing program. Many said it was the best program ever.

WEBSITE COMMITTEE REPORT

The number of visits to the website still averages about 1,000 per day. Doreen McCullough scanned the out-of-print quarterlies that are now on the web site. They are in searchable PDFs and can be read or downloaded for free. She has also scanned the complete collection of all Society Newsletters and these will also be placed on the website. Currently Doreen is scanning the Town of Rutland Reports for 1857 (the first published report) through 1894.

The Web Committee is reviewing the structure of the website and may be consolidating some sections to make them more user friendly.

The Web Committee will also be adding the Society Collections Finding List to the web site.

1884 MAP VERSION

The 1884 map project has moved to a much more usable version 2 disk. Anyone with a version 1 disk can request an exchange at no cost. Most replacements have already been made. The map project received an Award of Merit from the Vermont Historical Society on 6 November at the St. Albans meeting of the League of

Local Historical Societies. Clifford Giffin and Jim Davidson worked on the scanning. Clifford spent hours knitting the pieces together. Chuck Piotrowski put the map sections into PDFs and onto a computer disk with high quality images that are easily and quickly accessible. The map disk is available for \$10 with free postage.

FINDING LIST REVISION

Carolynn Ranftle and Ron Hemenway have patiently worked for nearly a year on a complete revision of the Collections Committee Finding List. Carolynn has entered all files into the Past Perfect cataloging program—a huge undertaking. She then designed a report that organizes the materials into a three-level hierarchy. The third level files have the file name, document box number, and the location of the material.

In addition, Carolynn has provided a small search program for the finding list on the Society's computers. In the near future some elements of the Finding List will be placed on the website.

SOCIETY ACTIVITIES

The activity of the Society during the last quarter of 2009 was particularly symbolic of the steady growth of the Society during its 40-year history.

Helen Davidson, Chairperson of the Research Committee, continues to produce "Tidbits from Then and Now" for *Sam's Good News* with occasional help from other members of the Society. This popular item has now exceeded 540 issues.

The Society sale on 10 and 11 October was a two-fold success. It earned over \$450 and eliminated much unneeded material from the basement. Bob Ranftle and Clifford Giffin of the Space Committee did an extensive inventory of the basement that was a great help in identifying "stuff" to go.

Jim Davidson has been doing monthly "Music of the Past" programs at "The Pines" for over 12 years. The fall programs included the music of "Bada Bing Bada Boom" from the 90s, Glenn Miller from the 40s, "Jukebox Nights" from the 50s, and holiday music for a Christmas party.

In a more traditional mode, Jim visits Loretto Home and the Kervick Center on alternate months to share a "Memory Day" topic.

On 19 October Jim Davidson led a walking tour for a group of Bardwell residents.

On 10 November Lloyd Davis, accompanied by Jim Davidson, presented a program on the "Flood of

1947" at a meeting of the Rutland County Association for the Blind.

On 19 November Jim Davidson presented a program on "Rutlanders in the American Revolution" for the Daughters of the American Revolution at their luncheon meeting.

Although the Society got rained out for the Halloween Parade this year, it did loan material to the Chaffee Art Center for their exhibit for the 50th Anniversary of the Rutland Halloween Parade.

Fred Pond, Vermont Historical Society volunteer, visited the Society to inventory the Society movie film holdings. He is doing an inventory of the movie film holdings of the VHS and local societies. He has found some Rutland film in the VHS collections. Some film needs treatment to prevent further deterioration and some needs to be preserved by digitizing it.

RUTLAND COUNTY CEMETERY BOOKS

Margaret Jenks of Granville, NY has produced cemetery books for all of the cemeteries in Rutland County. These are organized by towns and each includes a name index. The Society has had the books for the old Town of Rutland for some time but often the Research Committee and visitors doing genealogical research could use the books for other Rutland County towns.

Recently Dorothy Whitford, board member, decided that her personal coin jar might help the Society to do some project that was useful but was not budgeted. The coin jar covered nearly the complete cost of the completion of the Rutland County volumes. Other members quickly met the small balance of the purchase. The Society has added a valuable collection to its research library thanks to generous volunteer members.
