July Guns of Colonial Patriots: The Battle of Hubbardton Revisited

This issue of the Quarterly contains a follow-up to "July Guns of Colonial Patriots: The Battle of Hubbardton," and it is also written by Carmine A. Pacca, who became an active member of the Rutland Historical Society in 1973. The article concentrates on statistically assessing the strength of all three armies involved in the battle of Hubbardton, and it also addresses how the British handled the prisoners and the dead after the battle (Ebenezer Fletcher's experience is given particular attention). Pacca stresses the admirable bravery of the Continentals.
