Vermont was the last frontier of the colonial United States to be settled by white Europeans. Because of this, there was a lot of conflict over territorial claims between the other colonies. This quarterly explores the changing borders of Vermont, from its early French settlement in 1666, to its induction as the 14th state. This includes the border disputes between New York and New Hampshire, the sale of towns owned by the State of Massachusetts, and the effects on the residents of the outcome of the Revolutionary War. As an added bonus, a variety of maps are included, showing the ever changing borders and inhabited regions. If you are interested in early Vermont geography, this quarterly is a must read.
