**Henry Ripley Dorr in the Splendid War of 1898**

**This quarterly reprints the letters of Henry Dorr, a 39 year old volunteer in the Spanish-American War who corresponded with the *Rutland Herald* regarding the activities of his regiment. The quarterly supplies a series of letters from Dorr regarding a variety of subjects, including: the journey from Vermont to Chickamauga, Georgia; the daily schedule of a soldier in his regiment; and the overwhelming sentiment among his fellow soldiers to see action and finally be called to war. To the dismay of Dorr and his comrades, the 1<sup>st</sup> Vermont Regiment was soon recalled without ever seeing battle and having a chance for glory.**

## Pine Hill Stone Crusher and Early Stone Crushing Practices

This quarterly examines early techniques used in stone crushing. It focuses on the types of stone used for surfaces and the different machines used to pave the surfaces. Most of the roads in Rutland are described in detail, including what type of stone was used, where the stone that was used for the road came from, and the paver that was used for the job. All of these descriptions are supplemented with a map of Rutland's streets along with photos of stone crushers, a newspaper article regarding stone crushing on pine hill road, and an inventory of stone crushing equipment from 1924.
