#### MICROFILM EDITION OF RUTLAND DIRECTORIES

A microfilm edition of the Rutland Town/City Directories for the years 1867 to 1945 will be published soon by the New York State Library in Albany, NY. Dillon, the original compiler of these directories was from the Albany area. Thus the New York State Library has a large collection of these items. They have contacted the Rutland Historical Society and we have been able to assist in locating all years published except one. The year we are unable to locate is 1882-83. Although we have located a copy of the 1876-77 directory, we would like to find a copy that bluco borrow we for microfilming. Microfilm copies of these directories will be available for purchase at a reasonable price.

The New York State Library has found that the great research use of these items has threatened their existence. Therefore they have microfilmed their New York directories. The Rutland project is the first of the filming of similar materials from neighboring states.
