
Continuing Directors are Lloyd Davis and Clifford Giffin. Clifford Giffin was re-elected as Board Chairperson at the November board meeting.



IBM AWARDS GRANT TO SOCIETY

The Society was recently awarded an IBM Community Grant to be used for its digitization effort. The primary purchases using the grant money were a special scanner to scan photographic negatives, up to a size of 8 inches x 10 inches, and a hand held wand scanner. The first project for the negative scanner will be Frank Hinchey's collection of negatives from the 1930s, which will be loaned by Angela Hinchey. We hope to follow that with other negatives held in existing collections and will also ask the community to donate or loan old negatives which they may have lying around. The hand held wand scanner will be useful for scanning books and fragile material which cannot go through a regular scanner. It will also come in handy for visitors to scan material, which they can then transfer to their own electronic device.
