In the search box at the top of the video player, type in "Historically Speaking" then click on the magnifying glass button to the right. You should get a choice of the two most recent programs.

Episode # 136 – Gouger Hill – Guest William Powers was the author of a Quarterly entitled "Tales from Gouger Hill." It was known that Irish alcohol-fueled activities in the area led to the naming of Gouger Hill. What Bill and his fellow researchers uncovered is that there was a real character named "Gouger" McDonough. The McDonough Family story and other tales of Gouger Hill are reviewed in this program. Episode # 137 – An Awards Celebration – Three Society members were invited to share the story of their state-wide or national awards that were recently received within weeks of each other. 

MAJOR AWARDS

Three of the Society's volunteer members recently received state-wide or national major recognition within weeks of each other.

Ben Burdge received an award of merit for his production of a 50 minute virtual walking tour of the two historic districts in Rutland City. This can be viewed on the Society website.

Carolynn Ranftle won an achievement award for her work on cataloging the Society's collections and producing a Finding Guide which can also be found on the Society website. This award also recognized her organizational work as a past president.

These two awards were made by the Vermont League of Historical Societies & Museums.

Michael F. Dwyer was named a Fellow of the American Society of Genealogists by this prestigious organization. There are only 50 fellows in the organization. Michael was one of two recently named fellows. He also is the first fellow from the state of Vermont. The award recognizes his many contributions in the field of genealogy.

NEW PUBLICATION

The Rutland Railroad published a company magazine called the Rutland Newsliner from 1952 to 1960. The Rutland Historical Society is fortunate to have a complete set of all nine volumes. This collection has been digitized by the Society on disc and is now available for \$10.00.
