

## Report of the Board of Penal Institutions

---

*To His Excellency, John A. Mead, Governor of Vermont:*

We, the undersigned, members of the Board of Penal Institutions, in compliance with the requirements of law, would respectfully submit to you our report as to expenditures, management, and condition of the State Prison for the biennial term ending June 30, 1912.

For statistical information we would refer you to tables following and to those in the report of the superintendent.

The most noteworthy change in the management has been a slight attempt to adapt to the requirements of the prison the bonus plan based on the principle that a man must have some personal incentive to induce him to do good work, that he must have a reward to work for and that that reward must not be too far away. On account of the system of leasing the labor of the inmates this could only be done through the co-operation of the contractors, Messrs. F. C. Hebard & Co. They commenced by offering the men a certain bonus for whatever work they accomplished above the amount regularly required, which was in no case large. This resulted in a very material increase in the output of the shop and at the same time a material lowering of the cost of production. This system was not kept up for very long because it was not possible to supply sufficient work for the men to do, but it is hoped that it will be resumed in the near future. The nature of the work makes it difficult to offer a bonus to all the men, but the results obtained by this experiment were so satisfactory that Messrs. F. C. Hebard & Co. decided to give all the men who did satisfactory work through the week a half-holiday on each Saturday although they paid the State for their labor just the same. The superintendent of the prison makes this a real half-holiday, not keeping the men shut up in their cells, but allowing them the freedom of the prison yard, where various games are indulged in, and the awful monotony of prison life is broken up. This move has brought about an excellent spirit among the men who have responded in a manner to please all concerned.

It is our belief that this principle can be carried much further with good results to the prisoners and their families both morally and financially, and with financial benefit to the State as well.

The prison is far from being self-supporting, nor can it be made so if the prisoners are treated as modern civilization demands until we can obtain a materially higher price for their labor. It was only with the greatest difficulty that the present contract was made, as the previous one was suddenly terminated during the depression of 1907-8 by the death of the contractor and few people would listen to any suggestion of extending their business at that time. Though we succeeded in obtaining the same price called for in the former contract made by our predecessors, we are of the opinion that on the expiration of this contract, May 1, 1913, the State should insist on a materially higher price with provisions for the prisoners receiving a percentage of what they earn above a certain amount, or that the State should engage in the business itself. To this end we would recommend that the coming legislature investigate this subject with care and if it thinks favorably of the idea that it provide means for carrying it out.

The plant is in excellent condition, the health of the inmates has been good and we are glad to commend highly the work of Superintendent Lovell and his officers.




