# CATALOGING THE SOCIETY LIBRARY

President Jake Sherman and Jim Davidson of the Collections Committee are working on weeding books in the Society library and will follow-up by cataloging the full library in the Society computer system.

#### CHAFFEE-SMITH LUMBER COMPANY RECORDS

The Chaffee-Smith Lumber Company records have been languishing in the Society basement since they were acquired. Over the years there has been no use of the collection but it has taken up a great deal of space. It was decided that the UVM Special Collections might be a more appropriate place for the collection where professors and graduate students might make more use of it. UVM Special Collections agreed and it has been moved there. The material will still be available for public use. The Society will retain records of the collection's contents.
