## NEW MAPS ON THE WEBSITE

The map section of the Rutland Historical Society website can be found at [rutlandhistory.com](http://rutlandhistory.com) in the Images Section. The maps can be enlarged significantly so that each allows names to be easily read. The 1884 map, that was scanned in-house and was for sale on a disk, is now available free on the website.

The maps include (1) Cockburn's 1771 Map of Socialborough, (2) a 1794 plan of Rutland Town, (3) an 1852 Village Map of Rutland, (4) the Scott's 1854 Map of Rutland County, (5) 1869 Plan of Rutland (The map enlarges with double clicks of the cursor), (6) 1869 Beers Map of the Town of Rutland, (7) The 1881 Map of Rutland County. When enlarged this map shows road numbers in the various towns. These numbers coordinate with the names in the Child's Gazetteer Directory. The Child's Gazetteer can be found in the Collections Section in the Digital Bookshelf under "Gazetteers". (8) J. F. Beers 1884 Map of Rutland (described above) includes all parts of the Town of Rutland. (9) The 1885 Map of Rutland appears as a panoramic view of Rutland but enlarges to show sketches of Rutland buildings in great detail. At the bottom of the page there are 57 identified buildings whose matching numbers are on the buildings.
