G.H. Grimm Company

In this article Robert F. Moore describes the development of the Vermont Maple Syrup Industry led by G.H. Grimm. “He was an inventor, marketing genius and business and community leader”. After his death at 64 in Rutland, his daughter Nella May Grimm Fox continued running the business for 37 years.

The development of the organization is discussed in detail with illustrations accompanying the article to illuminate its progress. They include the Champion Evaporator patented in 1886, with accompanying price list; a price list of maple syrup in 1915; sap spouts manufactured by the thousands and a picture of the wood burning Grimm Kitchen Range produced until 1900.

As an addendum there are two pages of numerous recipes for using maple sugar in cooking, candy making, and a variety of other treats worth investigating.
