Museum Workshop

The Cover of the quarterly lists the agenda of a Workshop presented by Mr. John F. von Daake, Supervising Planner of the New York State Museum in Albany, New York, who made specific recommendations for three new museum planned for Rutland. The meeting took place at the College of St. Joseph in 1972.

A major section of the quarterly is given over to a review of a book called “A Girl of the ’80’s”, a biography of Charlotte Conant who taught in Rutland for a year in 1887. A number of well known members of the community are named, including a wealthy industrialist, Mr. Wheeler, who was so impressed by Miss Conant that he purchased Dana Hall for her.

The end page contains an invitation to a program discussing the paintings of James Hope, who taught school in West Rutland, as well as Painting at the Castleton Seminary.
