John Pixley Clement: Personal Impressions of the Great War (1914 - 1919)

This issue presents John Pixley Clement's impressions of the First World War, in which he served in its entirety as an officer of artillery in France.

These recollections are edited by Kendall Wild, a former editor of the Rutland Herald who met Clement's in the 1950's when he joined the news staff as a copy editor.

The Journal which covers all of the 1914-1919 war, opens with his early years prior to the war, and then continues to describe his military experiences in great detail.

Numerous photographs of family, friends and drawings by Mr. Clement of scenes of war are included, to make this a highly readable and interesting account.
