Autumn in Vermont

The opening pages of the Quarterly are dedicated to photographs of the “Rutland Navy”, an amphibious personnel assault transport of the Second World War, as viewed by E.J. Scieszka, a former crew member.

Photography, the major focus of this issue next introduces Warren W. Dexter, whose photographs appeared regularly in “Vermont Life” and a variety of other publications. Photographs of farms and rural scenes were a major emphasis of his work.
