"Jan"

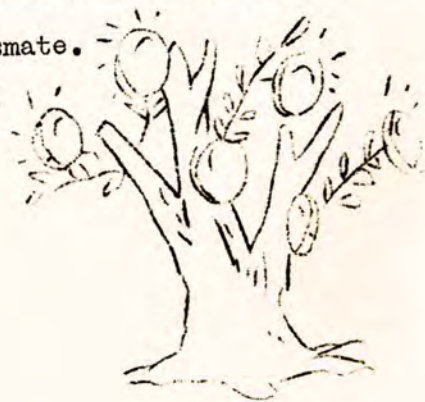

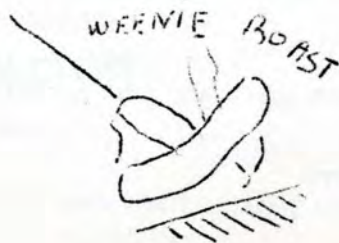
THE CLASS PICNIC
