THE MEN WHO CARVED THE GRAVESTONES OF RUTLAND COUNTY, VERMONT

COMPILED BY MARGARET R. JENKS

- This project began about 1976, as part of a project of the Genealogisal Society of Vermont, to have a file card for every name in all of the cemeteries in Vermont. I copied all the stones in Wells and Poultney, Rutland County and typed the cards.
- In 1981, I purchased a TRS80 Model 3, with 64K memory, computer to prepare for publication, my notes on the Descendants of Thomas Horton of Milton and Rehoboth, Massachusetts.
- Learning to format the notes was a major learning job. Each file could not be more than 6-7 pages long. Because I had the records of the cemeteries in Wells, I decided to type them into the computer and use the indexing program to make the index as a learning project.
- I made then into a book with a cardstock cover and offered it for sale. They sold! Then I did the same with the Poultney records and offered them for sale. Gradually, all 27 towns were compiled and became books.
- In the meantime, I joined the Association for Gravestone Studies. One of the special projects was the identification of the gravestone carvers. There are a number of ways to do this. The easiest way is to find a signed stone. Then you can compare the carving on the tympanum and lettering with other similar stones. Another means of identification is through payments in probate records.
- Danielle L. Roberts joined me in the project of extracting the Rutland County Probate records to about 1850. We purchased the films and film readers. The Rutland District records are compiled into 5 volumes through 1849 in Volumes 1-22. Due to the loss of a number of the Fair Haven District original books, there are only 3 volumes to 1854 in Volume 23. Every event important to a genealogist has been extracted.
- Executors could include the cost of the gravestone as part of the expense of settling an estate. All mention of gravestones have been separated out and are included with these "carver" records. There were numerous payments for stones where no person was identified as having received the payment. A number of those identified have been found to be agents for the various suppliers.
- One important means of identifying a carver is his style of lettering. James Blachowicz, in his book "From SLATE to MARBLE, Gravestone Carving Traditions in Eastern Massachusetts, 1770-1870, he presents a chapter on identifying the various forms of lettering. APPENDIX 1, "The freytag27+ Scale", pp. 359-371. He found that the letters: f, r, e, y, t, a, g, and the numerals 2 & 7 were the letters most often distinct for the carvers in his area of research. I have used this method trying to separate out similar lettering. [See the numerous pages on notebook paper in with the various carvers work.]
- Mr. Gray Williams of Westchester, NY researched many stones in his area. The AGS "Markers XVII" (2000) includes his notes on identification. "APPENDIX 1, Useful Characters for Identifying Gravestone Carvers." He lists the major characteristics of each letter of the alphabet and each numeral. He also reminds us to look at the special characters.
- In searching the carvers in Rutland County, I found many had his special way of carving the ampersand.
- My daughter, Susan Feuer, took my pictures of many of the special characters and made small cards for many of them. Unfortunately, by the time she returned the cards, I had decided to turn this study over to others. We hope someone will find them useful.



- Upper bell: large or small? Placed at baseline or above it? Shape, g position of protruding "ear"? Lower bell: large or small? Closed or open loop? If open, shape of tip?
- Shape of serif at base? Shape of dot: round or angular? i
- Size, shape of serif at top? Descender: long or short? Shape, size of j curve at base? Curve ends in point, dot, or teardrop?



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



How to find gravestone carvers:

1. Try to locate signed stones.

The signature many times is near the base of the stone, but may even be on the back.

Some carvers signed with only their initials, more frequently the initial of the given name followed by the surname and perhaps Sculpt. or Sculptor

2. Collect names and dates of death of those with similarly carved stones.

A search of probate records for administrators accounts may show payments for gravestones. They were sold in pairs, a head stone and a foot stone.

4. Search town histories, old manuscripts, store account books, family papers that may show payment for grave or tomb stones or information about men who carved stone.

5. Search area census records starting in 1850 for men whti occupations such as stone cutter, engraver, etc.

6. Once you identify the work of an artist, then try to find unusual qualities in his work.

What type of stone did he use ?

How did he form his letters?

What style of lettering: upper- and lower-case, italics, spacing?

How did he form his ampersand. &

Other key letters to study: Aa, Ee, Ff, Gg, Jj, p, Rr, S (including the long form of the s, W, and 2, 3, 4, 5, 7.

Are letters properly formed or are some backwards?

Note the slant of the capitals.

Many carvers knew how to space their lettering, others traced letters from lettering books and when they ran out of space on a line, placed the final part of a work above the line.

How did he phrase the inscription? Did he always use "In Memory of' or "Here Lies" etc. Others had unusual ways of phrasing the inscriptions. While most stones read "John, son of James & Mary," Enos Clark of Middletown almost always used: "John, son to James & Mary."

Is there a verse on the stone? There were books with verses, however, some verses were very special about the deceased.

After you have identified the work of a carver, survey all neighboring cemeteries, established within the time frame your carver worked, within a radius of about 25 miles, for more examples of his work.

8. What information should be recorded about your carvers work?

Name of cemetery; name(s) of the deceased; date(s) of death; ages at death; relationship (wife of --, child of --); a brief description of the carving and condition of the stone

Photograph key and unique stones. A good clear photograph aids in identification of the unusual qualities of a carvers work.

Photographs should be taken when the sun is raking across the face of the stone casting shadows. This is usually between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.

10. Once you have identified a carver, try to learn as much as possible about his life. His own probate file may list his tools, unsold stones, etc. Census and vital records will show his family. Many carvers were relatives of other carvers. Land records may show he owned a quarry.

11. Keep careful records of your research. Document everything. Use primary records when possible. Don't believe everything in print. Don't jump to conclusions or make convenient assumptions

12. DON'T GIVE UP HOPE. The answer is waiting just around the next corner.

I sent all I had on Andrew to Laurel Gabel who sent it on to John Sterling. John found a record that Bolles & Horton had made the Coventry, RI stone for Crawford Mathewson Greene 1820-1821, an urn & willow stone. Andrew Horton would have been under age 20 in 1821 so I suspect he was an apprentice of Bolles, or the stone was back dated.

I have been unable to locate Andrew Horton in the 1830 census. His first child, Andrew Jr. was 1827 in Mass. but I do not know where. He had a child b. ca 1834 in CT (town unknown), one b. 1836-38 & another b. 1841-2 in Thompson, CT (yet he was in the 1840

Killingly, CT census age 30/40); a son b. 1849 Woodstock & dau. b. there in 1852. Then an infant died age 1 day in Webster, MA in 1853. In other words, Andrew Horton moved around frequently. His gravestone work spanned close to 40 years. Have you found anything in your study of CT stones that could be work of this Andrew Horton?

The majority of Enos Clark's stones were carved on the same very hard marble from the Z. Collins quarry.

Enos, with his twin brother, Theophilus, are said to have gone to Middletown Springs to prepare the way for their parents, Jonas & Avis Clark. Theophilus was married 28 Feb. 1788 Middletown VR, Elizabeth Wood. This places the brothers in Middletown a little earlier than the 1790 of the town history. Enos returned to Conn. briefly to marry Clarissa Cook at Preston, CT on 7 Nov. 1790.
