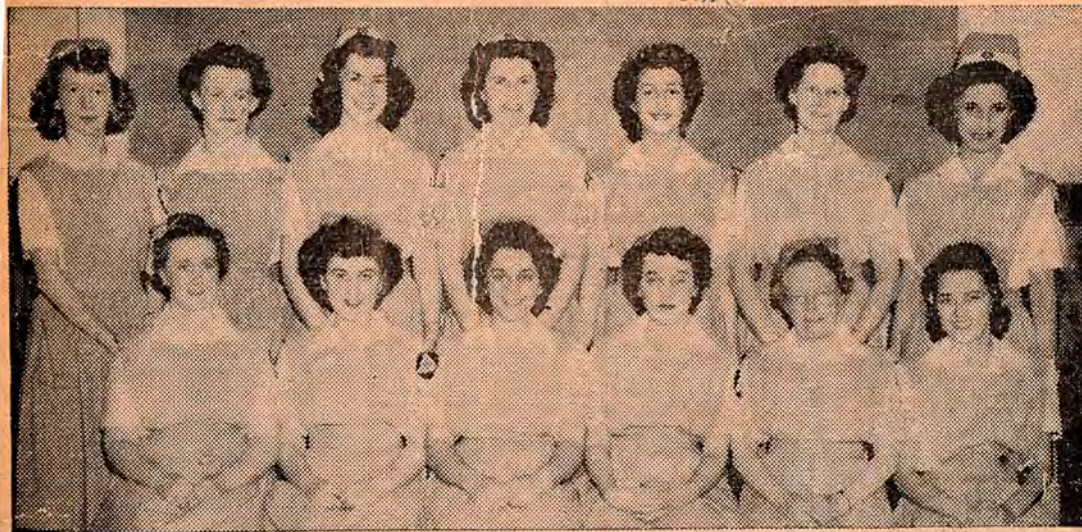

New Class of 13 Nurse's Aides Receives Caps at Hospital Here

Thirteen American Red Cross Nurse's Aides were capped last night in the doctor's room at the Rutland hospital.

The aides, who have taken the 80-hour course under the direction of Miss Ruth Corcoran, are expected to give at least 150 hours of service to the hospital during the year. With the graduating of this sixth class, 59 aides have trained at the hospital here and are taking over some of the duties of registered nurses.

Mrs. Earl F. Wright presented the newly capped aides with their pins which are donated by the Ladies' Hospital Aid society. Oliver D. Ward, chairman of the American Red Cross in Rutland county and

William Johnston, jr., representing the executive board of the hospital, spoke to the group.

Miss Mary Hanrahan, a newly capped aide, read the Nurse's Aid oath and F. Harris Leavitt gave the aides the oath of civilian defense.

In speaking to the group, Miss Amy L. Perkins, executive vice chairman of the American Red Cross, gave high praise to Mrs. Dora Metzger, an aide who has given 500 hours of service to the hospital.

The program was in charge of Mrs. Edward B. Jenney assisted by Mrs. Merton Ogden of the Nurse's Aide committee.

Miss Marjorie J. Burditt, an aide who graduated in a previous class, led the group in the singing of the Star Spangled Banner.
