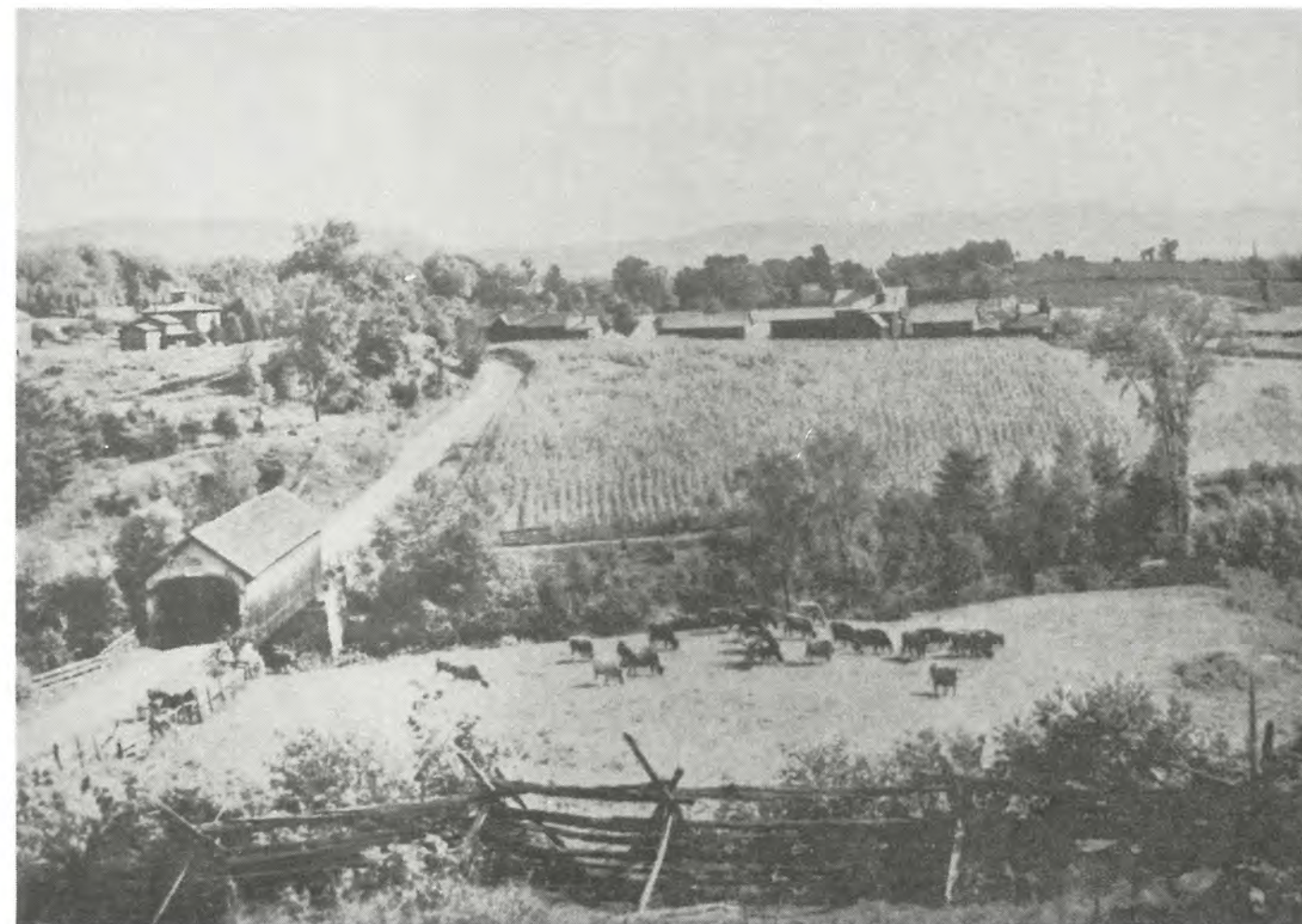

The History of The Rutland Country Club

The Rutland Country Club's history has paralleled the development of Rutland City since the 1800's. In its early days the Rutland Golf Club was located in the southwest part of Rutland on Clement Road. This layout was informally managed and maintained, but offered the quaint membership an extremely comfortable golfing environment.

In the late 1800's, the first known local golfing records were kept. A register dated 1897 presented a record of golf games played and a list of guests playing the local links. The first recorded club tournament, a putting contest, was held on October 1, 1897, as 42 participants entered.

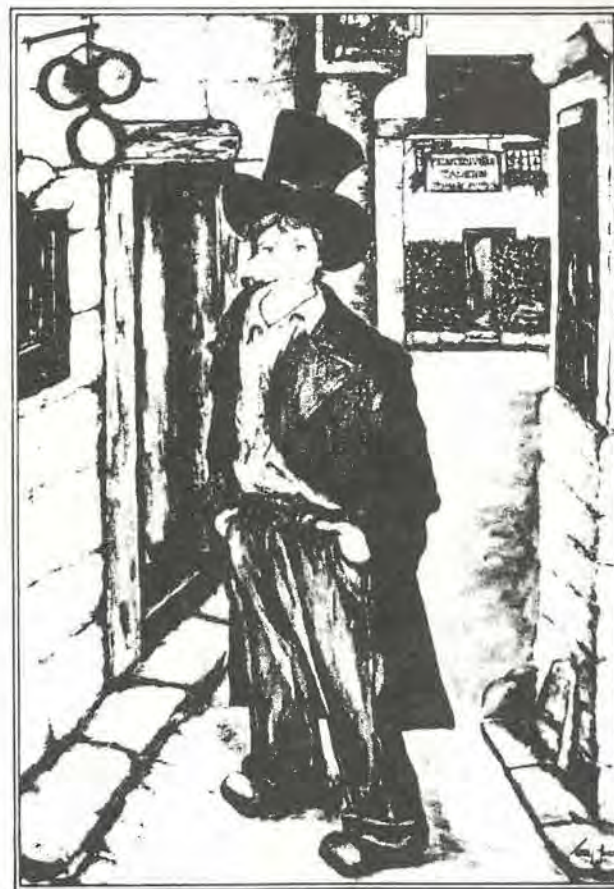

The best recorded score on the original Rutland Golf Club was 39 for nine, and 82 for eighteen holes, by William Dunn. In 1900, Erwin Baldwin of New York, recorded a hole in one on the 194 yard ninth hole played. Annual dues for members were twenty dollars per person. There was an additional five dollar fee for each family member that wanted a membership. Guest fees were one dollar. Guests were allowed to play if with a club member.

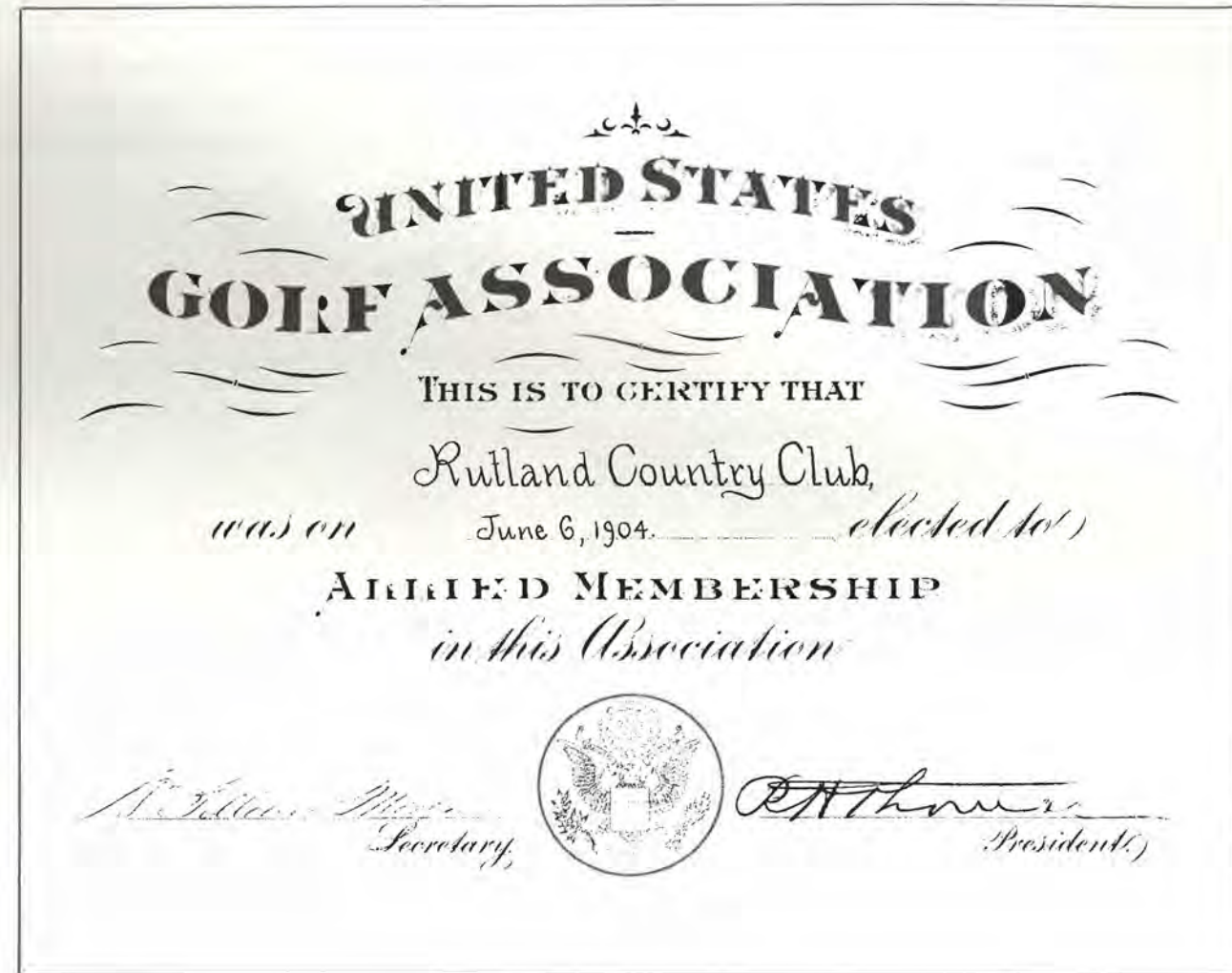
In 1902, a group of members headed by John Woodfin, Club President, and James Button, Club Treasurer, purchased the 382.2 acre farm of John N. Baxter for \$4,648. This portion of land remains today's — Rutland Country Club. George Low, an architect, designed the original nine hole layout at its new location.

Thomas Canty was selected as the club's first manager. Canty's main responsibilities included golf course and tennis court maintenance. Horace Ellwood and Joseph Brean worked as administrative managers. The golf course was completed in late summer, 1902.

In 1904, Rutland Country Club became a member of the United States Golf Association.

George Howe assumed the position of administrative manager in 1905. With his appointment Howe immediately concentrated his efforts on upgrading social and golf functions for Rutland's members.

Howe introduced an associate membership which enabled non-golfers an opportunity to enjoy club gatherings. Associate memberships cost between five and twenty dollars. Non-residents purchased associate memberships for ten dollars.

Herb Gillam became the Rutland Country Club's greenskeeper in 1910 and performed the duties of course maintenance and business manager. As business manager, Gillam observed the operation of the club's store, farm, golf and tennis assets. These activities provided the country club with additional financial support. The club's store stocked sundries, food, clothing, and golf equipment. R.C.C.'s farm created fee income as employees pastured cattle and groomed horses for club members, as well as sold hay, apples and milk.

Gillam lived in a house located on the club's property. On occasion, this house provided boarding for area visitors at modest fees. As manager, Gillam further developed Howe's social functions as he introduced supper memberships at a rate of six dollars (\$6.00) per member. Guest memberships were available for one dollar. During these dinners, a pianist, N. M. Bradley, was hired to perform. Bradley also exhibited his talents for the women membership groups at formal teas on the club's tennis court.

In 1914, Rutland Country Club's governing body decided to assess club members a one-time stock/initiation fee of one hundred dollars. Dues prior to the 1915 season increased to twenty-five dollars for residents, and ranged between thirty and sixty-five dollars for non-residents. The club also developed a monthly membership at a cost of twenty dollars.

In the early 1920's Rutland Country Club's development had been so impressive the board of directors recognized a need for a full time resident professional and hired Thomas Riley, as its first individual to fill the key position. Riley promoted golf and the Rutland Country Club to members and their guests. His knowledge of the game, and more importantly, his ability to teach golfing techniques, helped to improve the quality of golf by Rutland members during these years. George Morse, in 1923, became the first Rutlander to capture the prized Vermont Amateur Championship. Following his victory, Morse recognized Riley for helping him with his game.

Riley's ability to promote golf was such a factor, and the game had developed so much that Rutland's management considered a development plan for an additional nine holes. During the summer of 1926 club representatives met with golf course designer Warren Stiles, of Massachusetts, and prepared an outline for this addition.

On April 4, 1927, nearly forty out of town laborers began construction of the new nine holes. To accommodate these workers and their families, some of the then existing farm buildings on the grounds were torn down and the materials reused to build living quarters along the east brook.

The new holes were planned to be completed in the spring of the following year. This time frame was realistic because a minimal amount of heavy construction work had to be done since the existing farm land contour was continually well maintained. Rutland Country Club formally opened its new and present layout on May 1, 1928.

In 1927, James Murray became Rutland Country Club's second professional. Murray, a sociable individual, continued golf's development locally. During his thirty year stay at the Rutland Country Club, golf became the fastest growing sport in the Rutland area. With his ever present smile, and mild, Scottish-like voice, Murray became the state's premiere teaching professional. He dedicated himself totally to the game as he spent hour after hour on the practice tee with Rutland members. His expertise weighed heavily on the development of Rutland Country Club's most successful individual members, Mae Murray, (Jim's daughter), and Thomas Pierce.

Murray's enthusiasm for competition brought players together as Rutland developed the most extensive tournament schedule in Vermont.

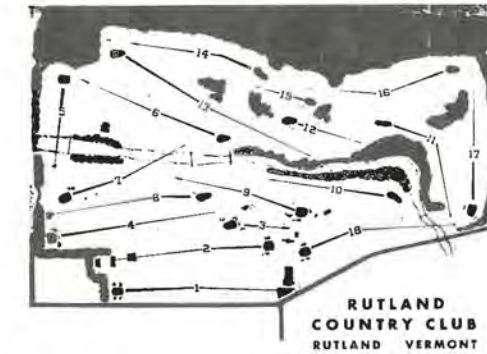
Robert Hawthorne became Rutland Country Club's third head professional in 1957. His innovative ability to run tournament and social functions followed in line with Murray's plan. He consistently brought new ideas into tournament and club activities as Rutland Country Club began to peak in popularity to local and visiting golf enthusiasts.

The fourth, and existing professional at the Rutland Country Club remains Henry Vergi. Vergi, upon his arrival in 1963, represented the new quality of a P.G.A. Professional. His extensive knowledge in all aspects of golf management was nearly unmatched when he started at Rutland. Vergi, a past greenskeeper and club professional provided himself with an understanding of golf mechanics and fundamentals which he immediately passed on to his membership. Today, Vergi claims the title of the highest money winning professional on the Vermont circuit and remains among the most active club professionals in formulating state P.G.A. activities.

Rutland Country Club's layout remains the same as when redesigned in 1927 with a minor exception. The flood of 1949, widened the east creek considerably, as it has remained a psychological element for players to deal with while touring Rutland.

Throughout the years, Rutland Country Club has played host to some of the world's greatest personalities of all time. U. S. President Calvin Coolidge played at the Rutland Country Club, as did golf legends, Walter Hagen, Bobby Locke, Gene Sarazen, Patty Berg, Betty McKinnin and Betsy Rowles. Baseball great Ted Williams still makes occasional visits to the area and strokes a few at the Rutland Country Club. Locke's eight under par 62 remains the course record.

Rutland Country Club's challenge from past to present has not put emphasis on length, but rather, places a premium on patience, position and accuracy. Each of the eighteen holes has its own story to tell, both positively and negatively, as golfers continue to challenge with enjoyment, the beauty and tradition of the Rutland Country Club.

Rutland Country Club — The Original Layout

The original layout of the Rutland Country Club was nine holes of nearly 3,000 yards in length and par was 37.

Following is a brief description of the original nine holes as related to today's layout.

Hole One - 365 Yards, Par 4

The original first hole was laid out similar to today's initial hole. The teeing area was much smaller as there was only one set of tee markers. The large group of pine trees, on the right side of the fairway today, were in minor stages of growth and didn't come into play. There was, however, a large trench that crossed the middle of the fairway. The original green laid short of where the present green is. The original was flat, and was well protected with sand traps and mounds.

Hole Two - 335 Yards, Par 4

Originally, the tee for hole number two was in the area where the ladies' tee is today. The same trench that crossed the first fairway was also present in the original second hole. Today, this slight indentation is still present but is not as deep as it once was. The green on this hole was forward to the tee from where it presently sits and was smaller than today's green. Hitting to the second green has not changed much from the original green to today's. An individual was required to pitch and run rather than hit to the flag due to the green's firmness and slight degree of slope away from the player.

Hole Three - 110 Yards, Par 3

Through the years, this hole has changed less than any other on the Rutland Country Club Course, along with number four. This hole did play shorter in the original days, than it does today. The major change in the third hole over the years has been a result of nature. The green has settled much in recent years, especially on the right side of the surface as it begins to present a bowl-type affect. From short of the green, there was a narrow path for players to walk up to the green. This walk way became known as a "duffers aide," as many shots would miss a small bunker and roll up onto the green. Later, the original sand trap was enlarged and joined with another relatively new trap to put added emphasis on ones' tee shot.

Hole Four - 490 Yards, Par 5

Once again, holes three and four have changed little since the original course design. The same trench crossing one and two also slithered through the fourth fairway. There also was a slight ditch-like area on the right side of the fairway. If a player hit into this area he would many times have to take a lofted club just to advance the ball back to the fairway. Since a portion of the fairway, near the green was cut into the side of a hill, many players positioned their next shots to the left in anticipation of a right bounce. Later, a ditch was made on both sides of the fairway and presented additional hazards. The green was originally forward toward the tee to where it now sits and was level to the fairway rather than elevated as it is now. Hitting to the original fourth green was much like hitting to the original first green.

Hole Five - 350 Yards, Par 4

The original fifth hole began in the area of where the eighth tee presently is. This tee was flatter than today's. Once again, there was a trench across the fairway. A slight incline is still present. The right side of the original fifth hole was the toughest rough on the course. The ball consistently settled in minor holes and would require a shot and in most cases many swings to get the ball on its proper course. The pines which are present on the left side of this landing area were not there originally. Players would then favor the left side of the fifth fairway for their first shot(s). The fifth green laid in front of where the present ninth tee is. This green was flat and well protected by a sand trap on its right side. At times, individuals approaching this hole would have to wait for the group in front of them to tee off to the sixth hole.

Hole Six - 300 Yards, Par 4

The original sixth hole began in an area near the present ninth tee. This hole flowed along the river toward the present fifth tee. This hole presented an individual trailing in a match, the opportunity to make up many shots on a single hole. The fairway was slightly tilted toward the same river and the green was narrow with a hard surface. On many occasions, players would purposely pitch their approach shots to land short of the green so as to protect against an unfriendly bounce into the woods which bordered the river. This strategy also afforded the player a better and safer pitch to the green.

Hole Seven - 210 Yards, Par 4

Rutland Country Club's original seventh was later converted to the modern fifth hole. The original tee was at the bottom of the hill guarding the right side of old number six green. Since East Creek was narrower than today, an individual had to carry the ball about 50 yards over to the fairway. The flood in the 1940's widened East Creek and required a change be made to the seventh tee. The approach shot to the seventh green was similar to one an individual would face today. The green was only slightly elevated and was bunkered well behind and to each side. The green's surface actually sat closer to the tee than it does today but was always one of the most difficult putting surfaces to figure out. This statement remains true today.

Hole Eight - 515 Yards, Par 5

Hole number eight, of the original layout, began in a teeing area near the present thirteenth green. The original eighth fairway is now that of the thirteenth. Across the fairway was a rough mound which presented an obstacle for fairway shots. This fairway was bordered on both sides by large bushed areas. The fairway shot was blind to the green. Players generally favored the left side of the fairways as it sloped toward the creek on the right. The original green sat in a position near the ladies' thirteenth tee and just in front of a small brook, also still present.

Hole Nine - 265 Yards, Par 4

The ninth hole began in a teeing area between the present sixth green and seventh tee. The individual playing was required to drive over East Creek. Bordered on the left by the same creek, and heavy brush on the right, added emphasis was stressed on positioning the tee shot. The approach shot has not changed, as the large guarding mound in front of the green had to be contended with.

Mae Murray Jones

Being the daughter of past Rutland Country Club Professional, Jim Murray, Mae was exposed to golf at a young age. "Daddy Jim" worked extensively to pass on knowledge and skills of the game. Mae continued developing her skills as she drove dilligently, on the practice tee day by day to master golf's subtle challenges.

Mae Murray spent the winter of 1949 in North Carolina putting the finishing touches on her game. This experience launched Mae on her way to an extremely successful career as the 1950 golfing season began.

That year, Mae introduced herself skillfully, at the national amateur level as she played herself into the finals of the highly prestigious Western Amateur Championship. Mae, though, lost to a respected Polly Riley.

Later that same summer, Mae traveled to the Golden Anniversary United States Amateur Championship at East Lake in Atlanta. This challenging test of golf was Bobby Jones's home course. In her first three matches of the tournament, Mae decisively defeated three national figures in Mary Crawford, Mrs. Charles Harbaugh, and Margaret Maddox, and gained a berth against Fay Crocker, a 20 time Uruguayan Champion and later a successful competitor on the LPGA tour. Their quarter final match remains the longest in the history of the event. Following six extra holes the match was postponed until the next morning because darkness covered the East Lake links. After three more holes, Mae, then the gallery's favorite, won with a chip and putt par. For the match both players recorded sensational two under par scores.

In the semi-finals, Mae continued her dream as she disposed of Helen Sigel three and two by virtue of even par golf for 16 holes.

Mae's next task was to overcome long-hitting, Beverly Hanson in the finals. After losing the first hole of a scheduled 36 hole final, Mae responded with three consecutive birdies for a two up lead. Hanson's extensive tournament experience, patience, and overwhelming strength proved to be too much for the Rutlander, though, as she assumed the lead and never faltered. Mae staged a late comeback but lost six and four.

Mae Murray Jones

In 1952, Mae earned a spot on the American Curtis Cup Team. The year, 1954, brought Mae a long sought Eastern Amateur Championship as she broke two tournament records (Low Score-71 and Low Winning Score-221). Her winning 221 score broke the previous record by seven shots on the way to an 11 shot victory over defending champion, Mary Ann Downey. The event was held in Connecticut at the famed Weathersfield Country Club. Following this victory, Mae retired from competitive golf until the late 1950's when she started a four year winning streak in the newly created New England Women's Championship.

The 1959 Championship was held at the Rutland Country Club, as Mae shot a record 228 total for a three shot victory over Mrs. Florence McCluskey, a five time Massachusetts Amateur champion. In 1960, Mae won by 15 strokes over Mrs. McCluskey and Glenna Collett Vare. Mae's third straight victory came at the Rhode Island Country Club as she made a clutch 12 foot putt on the final green for a one shot victory over a consistent Joanne Goodwin as well as Mrs. Edward McAuliffe, the 1955-56 Endicott Cup, 1959 Eastern, and 1960 Massachusetts Amateur Champion. For this title, Mae came back from a five shot deficit. Her fourth, and final New England Championship came in 1962, as Mae again defeated Mrs. McCluskey, this time by a margin of 11 strokes.

Throughout her illustrious golfing career, Mae also dominated the Vermont State Amateur Women's Tournament for a record six victories.

Mae Murray Jones' many accomplishments certainly have put her in a class by herself as she goes down in the history of the Rutland Country Club as "The Pride of Vermont and Queen of New England Golf."

"King Tom"

Tom Pierce is the most dominant male player in the history of the Rutland Country Club. He ruled Vermont golf tournaments between the years 1935 to 1950. During that period, Pierce captured seven Vermont Amateur Championships, a feat which may never be matched. Pierce's first title was captured in 1935, at the tender age of sixteen. Pierce may have captured more state titles, if it hadn't been for the fact no championships were held from the years 1942 - 1945.

In the forties, Pierce also qualified for four U.S. Amateur Match Play Tournaments. In 1941, Pierce lost to the prominent Ray Barrows on the last hole, in the New York State Amateur Championship title match.

Tom Pierce was one of the first players to capture two L. D. Pierce Championships. The tournament was named to honor Tom's father Leslie, a highly-respected figure in Vermont throughout its golfing history. The first of Tom's victories came in the inaugural year of the event as he defeated Pierce "Bud" Russell on the second extra hole, in the finals. In 1958, Tom won this tournament for a second time. Of Tom Pierce's seven state titles, three each were won at Rutland and Burlington links. The other came in Manchester at Ekwanok.

Pierce's most memorable state championship may have been his first. After qualifying as the medalist with a then tournament record of even par 70, Pierce, a brassy, 16 year old, held his composure long enough to walk through Robert Kinney of Rutland, six and five in the first match, Dr. A. H. Bellrose, another Rutlander two and one, in the second, and William A. Chesley of St. Johnsbury in the quarters. In the semi finals, Pierce met another fellow Rutlander, William Pond, and disposed of him two and one. Pierce then faced a previous champion, Leslie Mercer of Barre in the finals. Pierce, played like a seasoned veteran, and captured the title on the 40th hole.

Pierce won again in consecutive years, 1938 - 1940. This was the only time in the event's history a player won three consecutive titles. Following the years 1942 - 1945, when no championships were held, Pierce returned for the top honor in 1946 and 1947. His final victory came in 1950, some 15 years after his initial title.

In state championship qualifying rounds, Pierce was medalist outright twice, in 1935 and 1940. He also shared medalist honors in 1939 with John Boniface of Woodstock, and 1947 with Clifton "Ki Ki" Price of Burlington.

Prior to his death in 1974, Pierce joined the prestigious Winged Foot Golf Club in New York and played competitively and regularly with the legendary Tommy Armour.

Rutland's Men State Champions

In the seventy-eight (78) years of Vermont Amateur Championship competitions, Rutland Country Club Men members have captured sixteen (16) titles. This is the largest number of champions produced by any one club in the state, Ekwanok, in Manchester, has presented fifteen (15) of the state's best players, nine of which were in the tournament's initial eleven (11) years. Burlington Country Club members have captured thirteen (13) Amateurs.

The first R.C.C. member to win Vermont's highest individual award was George E. Morse with his victory in 1923.

Tom Pierce captured seven (7) state crowns, including three consecutively from 1938 to 1940. Each of these distinctions remain state records. Burlington members Clifton "Ki Ki" Price and John Donnelly have each captured four state championships, and remain second only to Pierce for their number of tournament victories.

Pierce H. Russell, Jr. and Art Bemis have been the only other Rutland members to win two Amateur Titles. Russell captured the event in 1934 and 1936. Bemis returned the state crown to Rutland, following a fourteen (14) year absence, with his 1980 victory and won again in 1984. Morse, William Pond, Jr., Henry Carroll, Richard Smith, and Anthony Russo, each captured single titles.

Following is a profile of each state championship captured by a Rutland Country Club member.

1923 — George E. Morse Champion
Played at Mt. Anthony Country Club in Bennington, Vermont



Morse tied DeWitt Balch of Equinox for low qualifying honors with a score of seventy-six (76).

On his way to the title, Morse defeated Leslie Mercer of Barre, T. C. Robertson of Manchester and Sayre McLeod of Bennington. In the thirty-six (36) hole final, Morse, a seasoned player, dominated youngster McLeod for a victory margin of ten (10) and eight (8).

1928 — William R. Pond, Jr. Champion
Played at Equinox Links in Manchester, Vermont



Ekwanok member J. D. Standish capped the medal honor with an eighty-one (81).

Pond's first match was against Standish, Pond, despite being four down after eleven holes won on the final hole. He then defeated C. L. Holden of Bennington and J. G. Estey, from Brattleboro, on his way to the finals. Pond, the Princeton University golf team member, battled his way through G. R. McKee of Montpelier, three (3) and two (2) in the finals.

1934 and 1936 — Pierce H. Russell, Jr. Champion
Played at Ekwanok (Equinox) in Manchester, Vermont

Medalist honors were captured by Gilbert Sykes with a seventy-two (72) score.

Russell escaped with narrow victories over Brattleboro's J. Estey and fifteen (15) year old Tom Pierce of Rutland, by a margin of one (1) up in his first two matches. Russell then ousted the defending champion, Clifton Price four and three as well as John Morse two and one to reach the finals against E. W. Taylor of Ekwanok (Equinox). Russell bested Taylor by a margin of seven and six for the title.

1935 — Thomas M. Pierce Champion
Played at the Rutland County Club, Rutland, Vermont

A medalist record, even par seventy (70), was shot by the then sixteen (16) year old Tom Pierce.

In his first matches, Pierce faced fellow Rutlanders, Robert Kinney, and Dr. A. H. Bellrose before confronting W.H. Chesley of St. Johnsbury and another Rutland member, and past champion William Pond. The final match pitted Pierce against veteran Leslie Mercer of Barre. Their match remains the longest state final confrontation in history as Pierce won on the fortieth (40th) hole.



Pierce copped his first of seven state titles in 1935. He also won in '38, '39, '40, '46, '47 and '50.

1936 — Pierce H. Russell, Jr. Champion
Played at Equinox Links, Manchester, Vermont

The eventual champion tied Clifton Price of Burlington for low honors with a seventy-three (73).

Russell then whipped H. R. Heneage, C. Campbell, Jr., J. Longacre, and Dr. A. H. Bellrose in his primary matches. He then frustrated Jack Morse of Barre, in the finals, by an astounding margin of thirteen (13) and twelve (12).

1938 — Thomas M. Pierce Champion
Played at Ekwanok in Manchester, Vermont

Frank Woodruff of Barre broke the medalist scoring record with a sixty-nine (69) for the top seat in match play.

In his first three matches, Pierce won convincingly over A. Laing of Barre, four and three, R. White from Bennington, six and five, as well as E. Wudsworth of Ekwanok, four and three. He then outplayed the medalist, Woodruff, for a two up victory. The finals was a battle between two Rutlanders, Pierce and "Bud" Russell, the 1934 and 1936 state champion. Pierce captured the first hole and never trailed as he posted a two and one win.

1939 — Thomas M. Pierce Champion
Played at Rutland Country Club, Rutland, Vermont

A score of one over seventy-one (71) was the medalist score as Pierce tied John Boniface of Woodstock for the day's best round.

In pursuit of his second straight championship, Pierce faced four Rutland members. He initially defeated fellow members, F. Burnham and C. Maurice, prior to meeting Barre's Frank Woodruff. Tom Quigley then confronted Pierce on their home links before bowing two and one. In the finals, Pierce utilized seven birdies in beating a final Rutland member, Jack Conway, seven and five.

1940 — Thomas M. Pierce Champion
Played at Burlington Country Club, Burlington, Vermont

Pierce scored a seventy-three (73) as he bested a strong field for medalist honors.

Throughout the tournament the eventual champion was never challenged as he disposed of Greensboro's S. Harmon, Brattleboro's Merrill Barber, Seth Densmore of Burlington, A. Sellberg of Barre, and Jack Crowley, also of Rutland, in the finals. The finals marked the first time the same two individuals met for the title in consecutive years. Also, Pierce became the first Vermonter to win for a third straight year.

1942 through 1945 — No Vermont Amateur Championships were Held.

1946 — Thomas M. Pierce Champion
Played at Rutland Country Club, Rutland, Vermont

Middlebury's Rolland Boucher qualified as the year's medalist with a score of seventy-four

Harold Whitham of St. Albans never got going as he went down in defeat to Pierce, three and two in the tournament's opening round. The next three opponents, though, made winning more difficult for Pierce. William Meany of Pownal, Robert Whyte, Jr., from Bennington, and Louis Lombardy of Manchester, all took the eventual champion the distance before losing. Clifton "Ki Ki" Price, the defending champion, faced the test of trying to stop Pierce's momentum, but bowed eight and seven. L. D. Pierce, Tom's father and President of the Vermont Golf Association, along with Leslie Mercer, the forty (40) hole loser to Pierce in 1935, and George Smith, the Golf Association's Secretary-Treasurer presented the championship bowl to the champion.

1947 — Thomas M. Pierce Champion
Played at Burlington Country Club, Burlington, Vermont

The previous year's finalists, Pierce and Price, shared medalist honors with a score of seventy-five (75).

On the way to his sixth amateur title, Pierce beat William Meany of Bennington six to five, Eino Rantanen of Rutland three and two, Dick Mulcahy of Barre two and one. In the semi-finals, another Rutlander went down in defeat as Gordon Garvey lost three and two. The finals was a rematch of the previous year. Pierce again downed Price and a furious comeback, for a two and one victory.

1950 — Thomas M. Pierce Champion
Played at Burlington Country Club, Burlington, Vermont

Dick Presby scored a seventy-four (74) on his home course for medalist honors.

Tom Pierce captured his record seventh (7th) state amateur title as he beat two Burlington members in the first matches. Moe Bourget and medalist, Dick Presby, fell victim to Pierce. James "Bing" Nelson from Bennington and the defending champion, as well as Duke Nelson of Middlebury, then lost to Pierce. For his third title match victory over "Ki Ki" Price, Price gained his final championship. In this match, Pierce won the first hole and never looked back on his way to a five and four win.

1957 — Henry K. Carroll Champion
Played at Rutland Country Club, Rutland, Vermont

Rutlander Ralph Clifford carved a five under score of sixty-five (65) for a tournament record, and medalist honors.

"Hinky" Carroll nerved himself through five close matches in gaining the championship. The initial two matches were both decided in Carroll's favor on the last hole as he defeated Gordon Garvey and John Patterson. Les Mercer then lost to the eventual champion three and two. Bennington's John Chapman played well in losing two and one in the semi-finals. Ken Lewis, then of Bellows Falls, jumped in front after the initial eighteen (18) holes, but could not hold on as he lost to Carroll, two and one, in the finals.

1966 — Richard Smith Champion
Played at Stowe Country Club, Stowe, Vermont

Peter Tice of the Proctor-Pittsford Country Club recorded a seventy (70) for medalist.

The twenty-two (22) year old Smith defeated Mike Tolero of Bellows Falls four and three, Dave Barnhard from Randolph one up with a final hole birdie, Burlington members, George Josinsky, six and five, and Gene LaVoie five and four. He then outplayed another Rutland member at that time, Marty Grover seven and five in the finals. For the thirty-one (31) holes played, Smith recorded one under par golf for the victory.

1980 — Arthur Bemis Champion
Played at Stratton Mountain Country Club, Bondville, Vermont

The tournament format was seventy-two (72) holes of medal play. Gary Girard of Orleans carded a one under par seventy-one (71) for the first day. The eventual champion, Bemis, was the thirty-six (36) hole medalist. Following the first day, Bemis was four shots behind the leader. He then took command on the second day and never trailed in recording a three shot victory over Dean Pierce, of Rutland, and Mike Dunavan of Copley. Rutlanders Brad Griffin and Anthony Russo finished tied for eighth and David Colomb ninth. Bemis recorded a score of two hundred ninety-eight (298) for seventy-two (72) holes. Pierce, is the son of seven time state champion Tom Pierce.

1982 — Anthony Russo Champion Played at Rutland Country Club, Rutland, Vermont

Fellow Rutlander Ron Cioffi surprised the field as he posted a two under par sixty-eight (68) score for the first day medal honors. Cioffi continued his pace the second day, and recorded a half way medal score of one hundred thirty-nine (139), one under par. Russo, the eventual champion, was in second place at this point, trailing by four shots. This deficit was extended to five shots on the third day. Russo then constructed a poised, fierce comeback and posted a four under par sixty-six (66) score to overcome the deficit. Russo scored two hundred and eighty-one (281) for the seventy-two (72) holes, only one over par and a two shot victory over Burlington's Lloyd Hier, Jr. John Esterbrook, Sr., also of Rutland, scored a hole in one on the par four (4) tenth hole and finished third. His score was three shots behind Russo's winner. David Colomb, another Rutlander, played the final thirty-six (36) holes in five under par for fourth. Cioffi slipped to fifth as a result of an off putting day.

1984 — Arthur Bemis Champion Played at Mt. Anthony Country Club, Bennington, Vermont

Reggie Colomb of Rutland posted the only par round of the opening day for the first day medalist honor. After the second day Colomb maintained the top spot and led by one shot over the 1981 State Champion, Robert Maritano of Rocky Ridge Country Club, and two shots over fellow member, John Esterbrook. Bemis stood five shots behind the two day medalist. Colomb's lead continued after day three, as Maritano lost a shot, Esterbrook two, and Bemis continued five behind going into the final day. Bemis, then on the last eighteen set a torrid pace on his way to a course-record tying score of five under par sixty-seven (67). He assumed the tournament lead on the fifteenth (15th) hole and sealed the victory with a four foot birdie putt on the final green. Bemis' winning score was two hundred ninety-five (295), two shots ahead of runner-up Colomb and five ahead of Esterbrook.

Quality Vermont Amateur Golf

The seventy-sixth (76th) state championship will always be remembered as one of the finest, week long displays of golf in Vermont Amateur history.

Rutland Country Club hosted one hundred fifty (150) of the state's best players for the fifteenth (15th) time and the first time since 1970 as each pursued the state's highest individual golfing honor.

In the 1970 tournament, Brattleboro's Robert Ratti slid through a high quality field for his second state championship in match play format.

The 1982 state tournament was played under a seventy-two (72) hole, medal play format. The Rutland Country Club course played as difficultly as it could play. The fairways were hard and tightly cut, the rough was long and thick, and the putting surfaces were firm, difficult to hold, and slick.

The pre-tournament favorites included: Ratti, Lloyd Hier, Jr., Scott Delaire, and defending champion Robert Maritano, all of Burlington, John Wilkinson, a consistent high finisher in state competitions, from Bennington and Freeman Allen of Middlebury. A group of Rutlanders, headed by Art Bemis, Tony Russo, Jody Larson, Brad Griffin, and John Esterbrook, were looked at as challengers rather than favorites.

A fact that only four times previously had a Rutlander won the praised title on their home turf created this scenario. The last time was 1957 when Henry "Hinky" Carroll won for the first time since Rutland Country Club victories by Tom Pierce in 1935, 1939 and 1946.

Prior to the beginning of the 1982 Vermont Amateur, many local golf enthusiasts predicted the winning score to be between five and eight over par. This theory seemed sound as the winning score in the most recent similar tournament at Rutland was two hundred eighty (280), even par, in the 1971 New England Amateur Championship. The critics also considered that the 1971 New England Championship field was much stronger and competitive.

In the initial round, a local favorite but unknown at this level of competition, Ron Cioffi, surprised everyone by scoring a two under par sixty-eight (68). Steve Durkee, another Rutland member, also recorded a sub par round as he carded a one under sixty-nine (69). Two other locals, Tony Russo and Tom Terenizni, were tied for third at even par seventy (70). Already, the difficult putting greens were taking their toll as many of the tournament favorites recorded scores in the middle and high seventies (70's). Cioffi continued his mastery over the Rutland Country Club links as he chipped and putted for a one over par score of seventy-one (71) on day two. His one hundred thirty-nine (139) aggregate score was the only number under par at the halfway point. Freeman Allen of Middlebury and Doug Farr of Stratton Mountain also carded seventy-one's (71's) to match the thirty-six (36) hole medalist, Cioffi with the day's low score.

The high second day scores were accredited to the fact it was difficult to hold the hard, platform like greens of Rutland Country Club. As approach shots landed on the surfaces they consistently bounded off and settled in the difficult rough which bordered each green.

Rutlanders continued to place high as Russo was in second, four shots behind Cioffi. Durkee slipped to third, six behind the leader.

On the third day, Cioffi carded his second straight seventy-one (71) score and extended his lead to five shots over Russo. John Esterbrook rode home a hole in one on the par four (4) tenth (10th) hole, as he finished with a solid, even par seventy (70) and maintained third place, six behind Cioffi. The best round of the day was carded by Rutland youngster, David Colomb, as he cruised to a sixty-nine (69) and stood a distant eleven (11) shots behind the frontrunner in sixth place. Just in front of Colomb was Hier in fourth, trailing by seven, and Durkee in fifth.

On the onset of the final day one could see the tournament was far from over and had the ingredients of becoming a real shoot out as Cioffi missed par putts on the initial holes. The chargers: Russo, Hier and Esterbrook roared out of the shoot as a four-way tie occurred after six final round holes. By the end of the initial nine holes just four shots separated the top six challengers.

Russo guided home a side hill birdie on the eleventh (11th) which gave him the lead for the first time. He then carded Cioffi-like pars ("chip and putt") on twelve (12) and thirteen (13) as he slid clutch six foot putts in on both greens.

Russo extended his lead, and continued a tremendous comeback against par in registering another birdie, a tap in on fourteen (14). Russo's finishing touch came on number seventeen (17), as he recorded his tenth three of the day, and assumed a three shot lead over the late charging Hier, and four over Esterbrook. Russo, a past assistant professional at Rutland, and an experienced professional mini-tour player wrapped up his first Vermont Amateur title on eighteen (18) as he tapped in a short par putt. Russo's closing sixty-six (66) resulted in a one over par two hundred eighty-one (281) score for the tournament.

Hier finished second at two hundred eighty-three (283), and Esterbrook third at two hundred eighty-four (284). Colomb finished fourth at two hundred eighty-seven (287) as he played the final thirty-six (36) holes in five under par. Cioffi slipped to fifth, seven behind Russo.

On the final round, six sub par rounds were recorded. Russo, Hier, and Colomb shot sixty-sixes (66's). Esterbrook a sixty-eight (68), and Jody Larson tied Brad Griffin as each closed with sixty-nines (69's).

Rutland Country Club was well represented throughout the remaining top ten spots. Steve Durkee completed a fine tournament in sixth, and Griffin and Larson, tied for eighth. Along with Hier, there were four other non-Rutland members in the top ten. Bennington's John Wilkinson finished seventh, Gary Girard of Newport and Peter Donovan, also of Bennington tied for tenth. Of the top twenty, 12 finishers were from Rutland (Charles French - Tied eleventh, Steve Olesky - Tied twelfth, Jim Hefti - Tied twelfth, Tom Terenzini - Tied thirteenth and David Carr - nineteenth), all fashioned good scores.

In all, nine sub par scores were recorded over the challenging Rutland County Club. This feat equals the number of sub par rounds in the 1971 New England Amateur Title, won by Fred Kask of Connecticut. Kask's winning score of even par two hundred eighty (280) defeated Bill Mallon by three shots. Thomas Lea, of Massachusetts, was third and recorded two hundred eighty-eight (288) for seventy-two (72) holes.

The 1982 State Amateur Tournament provided much excitement as the quality of Vermont golf reached a pinnacle. Throughout the previous seventy-five (75) state tournaments, individuals played well and competed fiercely, but never did a **group** of Vermont golfers perform with such mastery from start to finish.

For Tony Russo, the 1982 championship bowl will always be cherished.

For the Rutland Country Club, the memories of that title became another bit of tradition to be well remembered.

Rutland also captured the Governor McCullough Cup for team play on the first two days. Team members were: Russo, Larson, Griffin, and past state champions Art Bemis and Rick Smith.

Governor McCullough Cup

The McCullough Cup competition is played in qualifying rounds of the Vermont Amateur Championship. Any Vermont Club may enter a team in the event before the qualifying round commences.

In the initial years, a club's team consisted of four members' aggregate score. Today, the best of four of five scores are considered.

The McCullough Cup event started in 1905 and has been conducted in all years except 1918 and 1942 through 1945.

Rutland Country Club's finest players have captured the team crown twenty-four (24) times, more than any other club in Vermont. Burlington Country Club has won nineteen (19) times, and Ekwanok, of Manchester, fourteen (14).

Following are the years Rutland Country Club captured the McCullough Cup.

The team members, winning score, and runner-up club are also recorded.

Tournaments

Tournaments have contributed to Rutland Country Club's development throughout its eighty-three years of existence to date. Events of the club's early days were modest, one-day events for Rutland Country Club members and an occasional guest, and were more social than competitive gatherings. Men participants enjoyed a few holes of golf as their spouses participated in teas and luncheon meetings while observing musical, art, or fashion shows which took place on Rutland's tennis court when sponsored by the Rutland Country Club lawn and tennis club. Each tournament usually concluded with a club dinner following each day's festivities.

Good, consistent quality golf became apparent at Rutland during the 1920's and 1930's with the hiring of the club's first professional, Tom Riley. In the 20's George Morse, Hugh Clement, William Pond, Jr. and other Rutland Country Club members battled on the course with par-shooting abilities. Morse, in 1923, brought Rutland into the state's golfing lights as he captured the Vermont Amateur Championship, the first by a Rutland member. Pond followed with a victory in the same tournament of 1928. During these years, Rutland's image slowly changed from a social club to a harvesting ground for Vermont's top linksters. This image change led to an increased golfing interest within the local community and as a result, the original nine holes were integrated with nine new holes for the state's best test of golf.

The quality of golf played by Rutland members really improved during the 30's though, as head professional Jim Murray, extended his golf teaching ability to members. Even the less enthusiastic player became more intense as a result of Murray's enthusiasm. Pierce Russell and Tom Pierce stood challenges from other Rutlanders in the likes of George Morse, the Bellrose brothers, Alberic and Maurice, and others, as they captured five of ten state titles played from 1930-1939 between them. During these years, Rutland's club tournaments became very popular as members would compete intensely against their neighbors and friends. A large crowd of spectators would regularly turn out to watch these challenge matches.

During the 1940's, Pierce continued as Rutland's premiere male player as he captured Vermont's top prize three more times. Often he was challenged by John Conway, Tom Quigley, Joe Mumford, and Gordon Garvey, also Rutlanders.

Burlington Country Club became the most dominant state club with its high classed golfers; Clifton Price, Richard Presbry, William Chesley, Michael Ziter, Morty Kaufman, and Tad Cheeseman, during the 50's. Mt. Anthony, in Bennington provided the only real challenges to B.C.C.'s top players in any state tournament although Rutland's Henry Carroll claimed the state title in 1957.

Rutland's most successful tournament competitor in the 1950's was Mae Murray, daughter of the previously mentioned professional, Jim Murray. She reached the finals of the national women's amateur and won significant titles during those years.

Rutland's men returned to challenge other state clubs during the 60's and 70's and remains Vermont's top quality playing club in the early 1980's.

The Rutland Country Club tournament schedule has provided for much enthusiasm and fun to club members and guests. In 1950, the Leslie D. Pierce Invitational Tournament was introduced to golfers, and remains one of the top tournaments in the east. Rutland's Edwin W. The club championship brings the best out in each Rutland member. Eino Rantanen's record of thirteen final round appearances, with seven victories, remains the most impressive men's club championship record.

The William Walleth Member-Member Tournament is a team event which usually opens the golfing season at Rutland.

The President's Cup is a handicap event which allows all members an equal opportunity to capture a championship. R.C.C.'s golfing season winds down each year with the Italian Open, a one-day event, with emphasis on a good time; and the Dr. Edward Bove Memorial Snowball Tournament, a nine-hole weekend tournament.

Rutland's women also have an extensive golf tournament schedule throughout the summer. Along with the Club Championship and President's Cup, Rutland's ladies continue to provide competition in the Louise Bain Member-Guest Tournament. This outing remains the highlight of the ladies' season as each invites a partner for an eighteen hole golf excursion followed by a dinner and prize presentation. The Doris Brislin Member-Member Tournament is an opportunity for lady members to pay tribute to a past Rutland member. Another major event at R.C.C. is the Bronze Cup, a handicap record tournament for improving members. Rutland Country Club also plays host to exchange golf outings with other area clubs. Each year, R.C.C. is the sight of one of the largest women's state day turnouts as players come from all over the state to play Rutland. Wednesday has traditionally been Ladies' Day and with each comes a special event for women to participate in.

A further challenge to the club's men and women is the R.C.C. Scotch-Ball Championship. Whatever the day, or time of golfing season, there is nearly always a special event going on at Rutland which not only brings the best golfing out of people, but also the most enjoyable time.

Tournaments have long been recognized as a necessary part of a club's development. Each brings a meeting between the serious and not so serious golfer. To make sure each event is successful has always been a concern of Rutland's members. Volunteers, George Ellwood and Rex Shaw, in Rutland's early tournament years, and Nick Smiel, Marshall Kendall, John McDonough, Joseph Bove, Donald Stone, and more, have extended themselves and reflect the club's positive attitude during tournaments recently.

Leslie D. Pierce

— The Individual —

Leslie D. Pierce was a successful insurance and business man in the Rutland community. Although he was not a native Rutlander, **Pierce** took much pride in the area after he settled in the area following years of living in Rochester, Vermont.

L.D. Pierce was former Vice-President of the Bethel National Bank of Bethel. He later became a director of the Clement National Bank of Rutland.

For many years **Pierce** served as President of the Vermont Golf Association, a group dedicated to improving the game of golf within the state. **Leslie D. Pierce** was also instrumental in developing many of the Rutland Country Club's golf committees in an effort to improve the club's general operation. **Pierce** also promoted a positive, competitive attitude within the Rutland Country Club and was a main supporter in the organization of club tournaments.

Pierce was also father to two extremely successful Rutland golfers in the person of Thomas, a seven time Vermont Amateur Champion and Virginia (Smith), a two-time state women's titlist.

— The Tournament —

The **Leslie D. Pierce** Memorial Invitational Golf Tournament has been labeled as one of the "Best Invitational Tournaments" in New England and perhaps the east coast since its inception in 1950. The quality of players in the tournament each year, coupled with the rich tradition of the Rutland Country Club, makes the **L.D. Pierce** Title a notable sense of accomplishment within itself.

Since **The Pierce** is the most prestigious of all tournaments held at the Rutland Country Club, the golf course reaches its peak of condition during the event. The rough is normally higher and more difficult to play from during **The Pierce Memorial**. The greens are manicured to perfection, and, on occasion, much quicker than on days before and after the tournament.

In 1950, **The Pierce**, was introduced as a singles, three day event. This format remained the same until 1960, when best ball tournaments became more popular at the amateur ranks. In 1966, the tournament returned to singles play, but the following year, **The Pierce**, was returned to the team format and is played that way today. In 1970, the event was changed from three to four days.

The first **L.D. Pierce** Title was captured by Thomas Pierce, son of L.D. The final match of that year was close throughout as Pierce Russell gave the eventual champion all he could handle before bowing on the second extra hole. Thomas again won the title in 1958.

Edwin W. Lawrence

— The Individual —

Edwin W. Lawrence, Attorney and Philanthropist, was one of Rutland's most highly-honored citizens and received numerous awards for his large contributions to Rutland charities, and community activities.

As evidence of his extreme interest in the youth of Rutland City, **Lawrence** is well remembered for his gift of money to purchase the building now known as the **Lawrence Recreation Center** as well as a contribution enabling a Rutland Free Library addition to the original building. **Lawrence** also founded the University of Vermont Debate Club and was an active supporter of Middlebury College.

In the years 1923 and 1925 **Lawrence** was elected as Rutland County's Senator and served as Director of Central Vermont Public Service.

Lawrence also became a Vice-President for the Vermont Bank and Trust Company as well as the Killington Bank and Trust Company, now known as the First Vermont Bank and Trust. Later **Lawrence** served as President for the Rutland Trust Company.

Lawrence was an active member the Rutland Country Club and is well remembered for his generosity as he extended loans to the club during difficult financial times.

Lawrence's personal attributes are still apparent in the positive attitude around R.C.C. today, and are main ingredients in Rutland's rich tradition.

On March 11, 1967, **Lawrence** died at the age of 83.

— The Tournament —

In 1962, the Rutland Country Club Tournament Committee designated its member-guest outing as the **Edwin W. Lawrence Friendship Tournament**. Since 1968, this event has become known as the **Edwin W. Lawrence Memorial Tournament**.

The tournament format has been three days in length (in 1971 the tournament was extended to four days but returned to its original format the following year), and consists of a best-ball qualifying and match play style (in 1963 the **E.W. Lawrence** was a 36 hole, medal event).

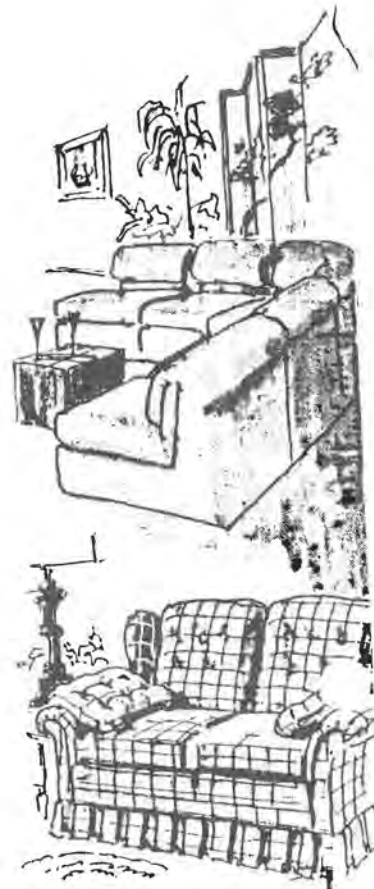

Reggie Colomb started playing golf when he was eight years old, while caddying at the Rutland Country Club. He spent ten years "growing in golf" as a pro-shop assistant under Rutland Country Club's professional, Henry Vergi.

Following a venture to Jacksonville University in Florida, where Reggie continued to improve his ability and knowledge of golf, he joined the Air Force. During his four and one-half years of service, Reggie worked in different capacities and continued to promote golf while employed at Inland Winds Golf Course on Loring Air Force Base, in Maine. Reggie was selected to compete for a position on the United States Air Force Golf Team from 1978 to 1982.
