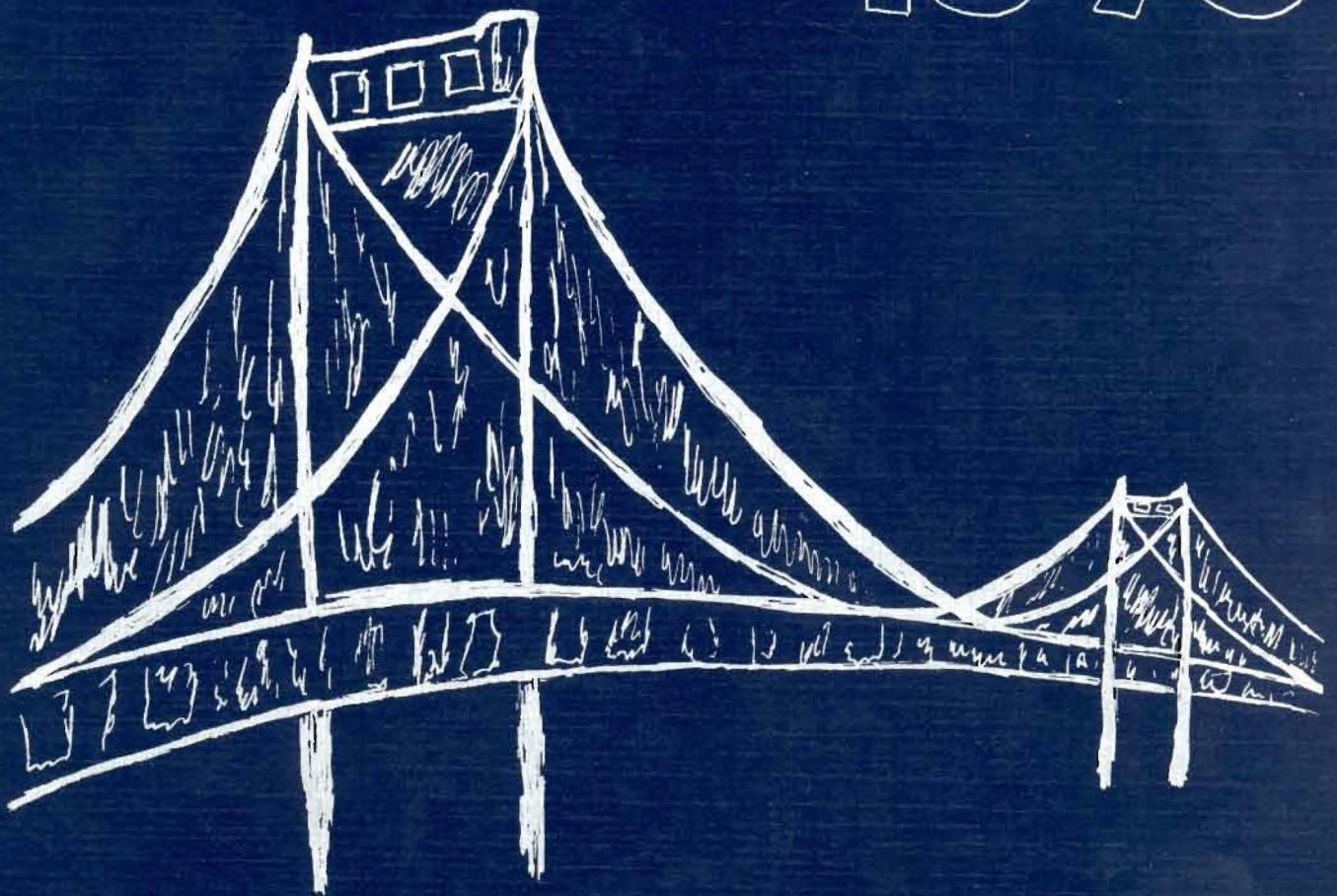
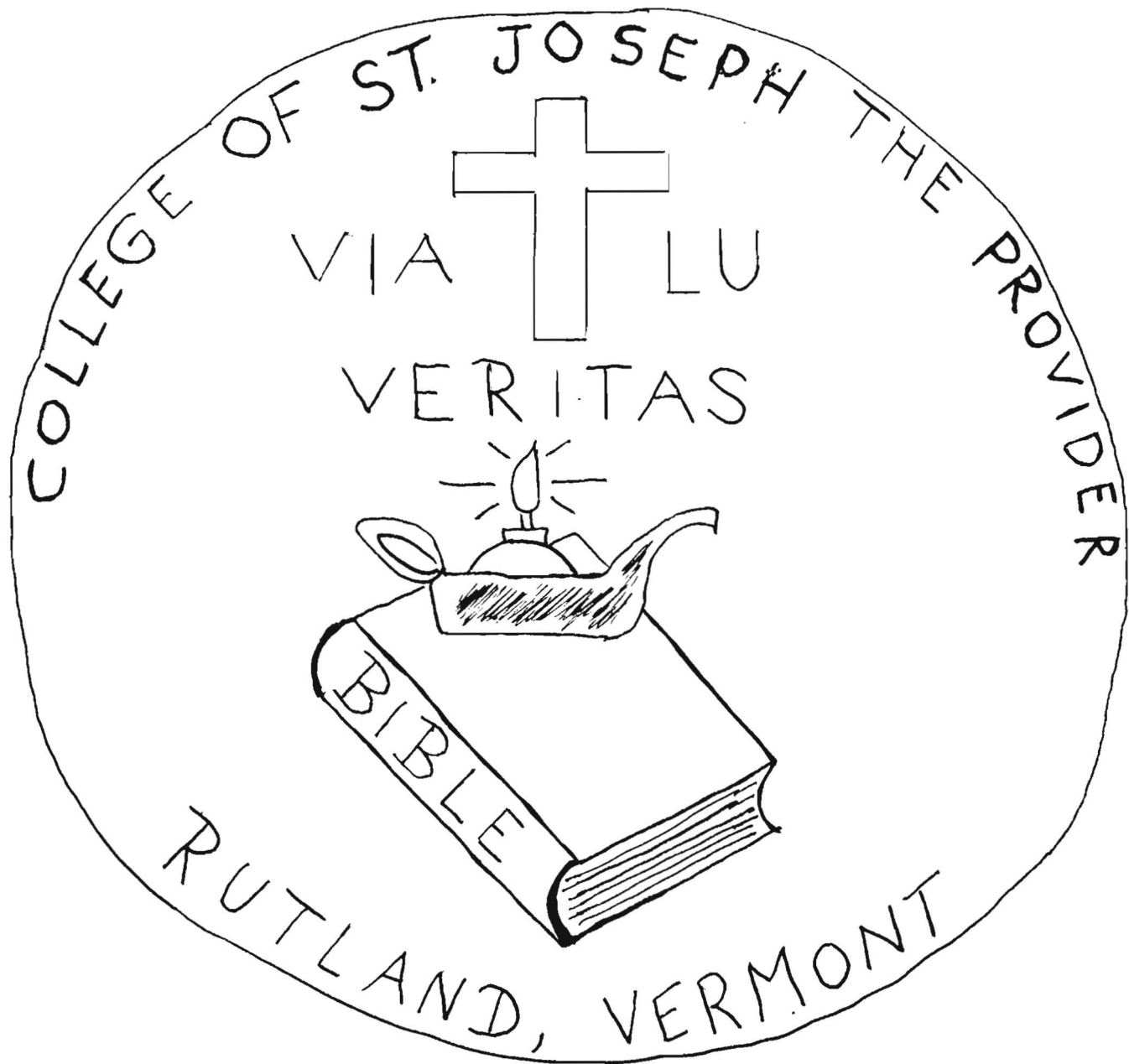


DEDICATION

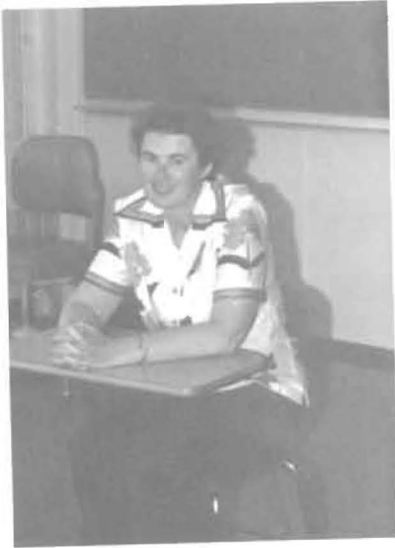

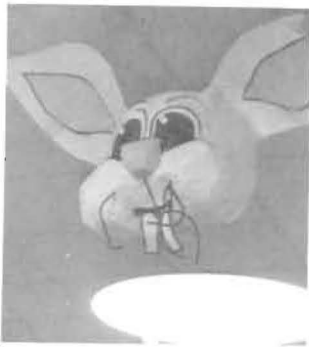

ENTER — BASKETBALL!

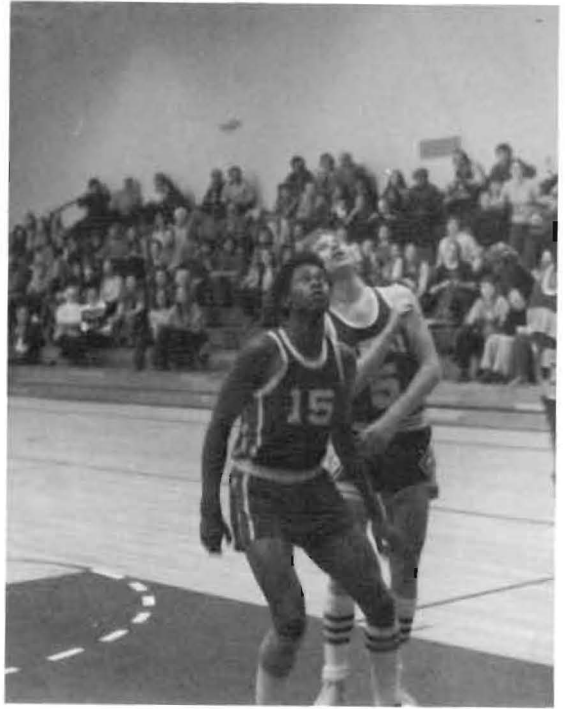

CSJP's basketball team entered into stiffer competition this year by joining the Mayflower Conference which pitted them against more experienced teams, thereby opening up the opportunity to greater challenges. Such challenges stimulated the team to achieve greatness, whether it came in the form of victory or defeat. In essence, CSJP supports the time-honored phrase: "It's not the winning, but how you play the game that counts."

As the "Cairn" goes to press, the '74 - '75 Saints season box score is 6 wins and 6 losses, with 1 win and 3 of the losses experienced in the Conference games. Many of the losses were only by a difference of 1 or 2 points, which certainly indicates the strength of our team even in defeat.


