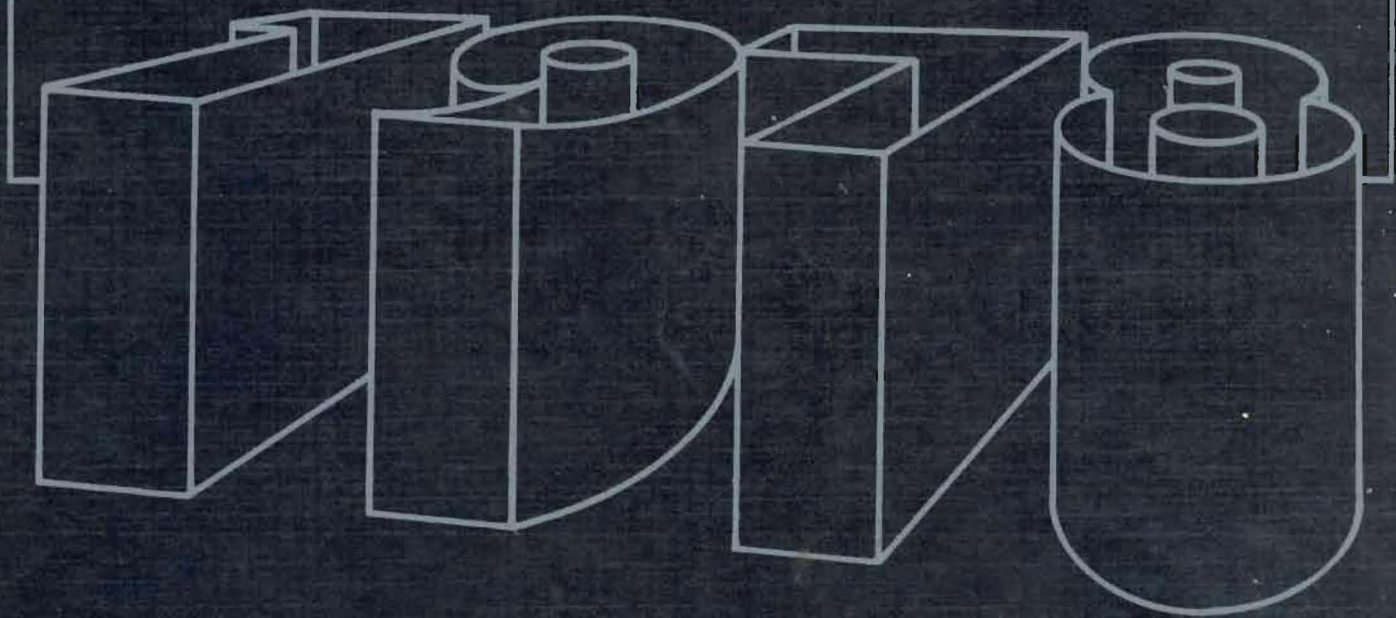

CAIRN, Kârn in archeology, denotes a mound of stones used as a marker or memorial. The term is derived from the Gaelic word 'carn', meaning 'heap'.

Cairns date from the New Stone Age. The use of cairns as burial markers was a worldwide custom. Frequently they were used as family vaults. The burial chamber of ten held urns and chests as well as dead from mutilation or desecration, and more stones were piled to make a marker.

Cairns were also used as road markers to commemorate important events. This is where the class of 1978 comes in. Life is a journey we must all take advantage of. 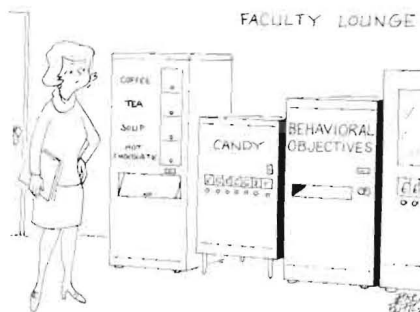

One of the first faces we met on that fateful registration day four years ago was this man. He was later to become an adviser to some, a teacher to many and a friend to all.

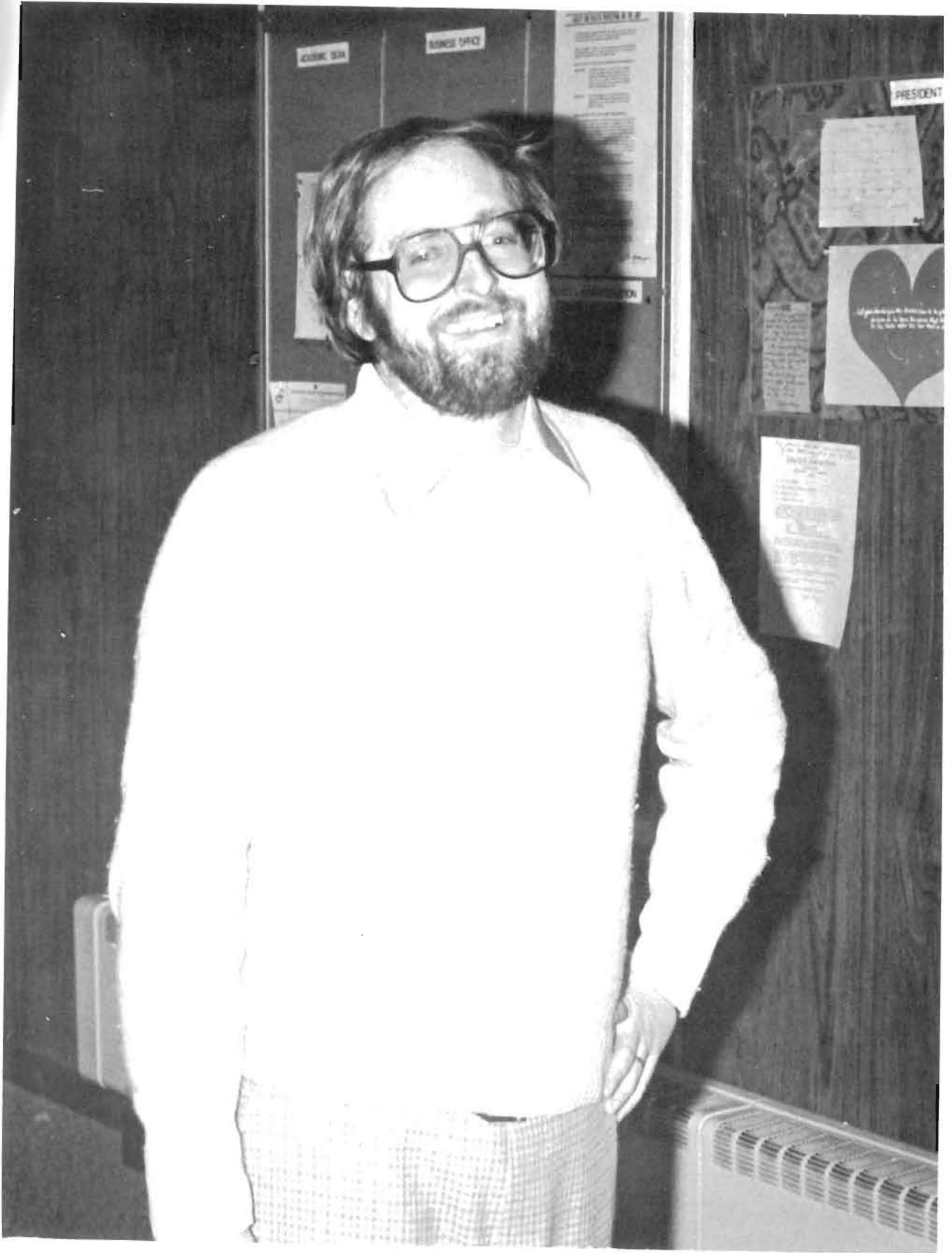

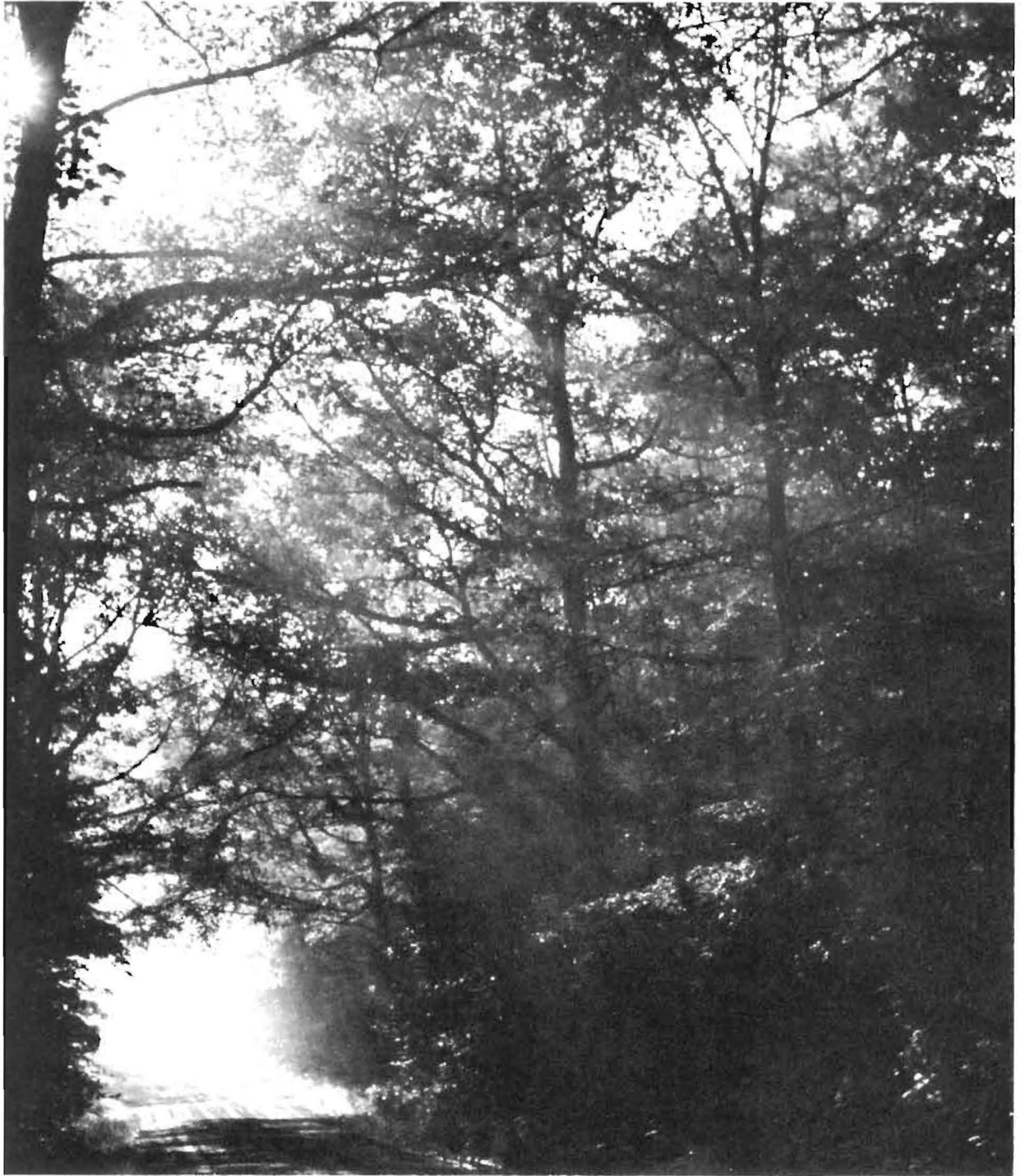


It was a time for learning;
